**Tuesday, June 20, 7-8:30 p.m., Summer Series Speaker, Dr. Karl Campbell, Associate Professor of History, ASU, will present “North Carolina and the New South: 1865-1900.”** As North Carolina emerged from the shattering experience of the Civil War, it had to rebuild its economy and society.

The “New South” brought big industries—textiles, tobacco, furniture—to the Tar Heel state and lots of exciting changes—country music, mill towns, big cities, and famous entrepreneurs like Duke and Reynolds. But the suffering of sharecroppers and mill workers also led to reform movements, strikes, and eventually the violent political crisis of the 1890, and the Wilmington Riot of 1898. By 1900 North Carolina looked very different than it had after the war. Come and share in this insightful presentation and discussion.
