Our next event in our 2022 Summer Speaker and Music Series will be "An Appalachian Murder: Depictions of the Tom Dula Murder Trial in the Postwar Press"

Tuesday, August 23, 7 p.m. Allison Fredette, Assistant Professor of History, ASU. Nineteenth-century newspapers were filled with lurid tales of crime and murder,



designed to attract an audience, and sell papers, but how did these murder mysteries shape readers' views of

different regions in this era? Specifically, how did the coverage of the now infamous murder of Laura Foster feed into growing stereotypes about Appalachia? Dr. Allison Fredette, a women's historian at Appalachian State University, will discuss the press coverage of a series of famous postwar murders, as well as the coverage of the Laura Foster case and how it helped define the country's ideas about Appalachia.
